Some logistics

- Submission and reviews done by EasyChair
 - Relatively smooth, with well known (mis-)features
- Final versions and proceedings collected and produced using LIPIcs system
 - Largely trouble-free
 - LIPIcs editing staff has some specific ideas of what your proceedings version should look like. It would have been slightly less frustrating if they spelled out what it is that the authors are **not** supposed to do in their papers: then they would have to spend less time undoing them.
 - Some setup issues unintentionally allowed the authors to overwrite each other's files.


