



Submission Process

- ☐ EasyChair: As usual, smooth and easy
- Quota: 500 lines (first time!)
- □ 184 abstracts; 166 full papers

Review Process

- ☐ EasyChair: As usual, smooth and easy
- Out of 166 full papers, 1 withdrawn while being reviewed, hence 165 papers underwent a full review
- ☐ Each PC member assigned 20-21 papers
- ☐ An 8-week process: 4w off-line reviewing + 4w discussions
- □ 535 reviews: 175 by PC members + 360 by subreviewers
- □ 276 external reviewers (each produced ~1.3 reports)
- 60/166 papers accepted (acceptance rate: 36.1%)
- Reviews per paper: 129 papers: 3 reviews
 - 32 papers: 4 reviews
 - 4 papers: 5 reviews
- No voting; all decisions reached unanimously













